So it should come as no surprise that as a member of the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee, John Giannetti cast the deciding vote for a sweetheart deal that would have changed the Maryland judicial system to benefit big tobacco (S.B. 339).

And it's no surprise that Giannetti is siding with big tobacco once again—refusing to support the Clean Indoor Air Act that would require smoke-free workplaces, restaurants and bars.
